

Troop 811 Challenge Coin

Youth and Adult Leader Award Requirements

The Troop 811 Challenge Coin Award was created as a means to recognize qualified registered youth and adult members within the troop who have met at least seven of the following eligibility requirements during any twelve-month period. Each youth and adult member is allowed a maximum of one coin per 12-month period. Eligibility can be repeated yearly, but qualifications must be repeated to be used towards earning a second coin. NYLT, Religious Award, Wood Badge, Eagle scout do not have to be earned within the 12 month period as the other requirements, but may only be used toward one coin. Qualifications may not be repeated within the same twelve months to count at two qualifications (i.e., attend 4 overnight events counts as one item, not two even if participating in eight). It is the responsibility of the individual to track their own progress, keep records of the accomplishments and submit this form along with the records to the Committee Chair.
